## Tallahassee Fireworks Guidance for July 4, 2026

For the 2026 Fourth of July in Tallahassee, the main public fireworks event is the City of Tallahassee’s “Celebrate America” at Tom Brown Park, with additional displays in nearby areas. Always follow city safety rules and attend licensed displays to avoid risks.

### Main Public Event

- **Event:** *Celebrate America* – City of Tallahassee’s signature July 4 celebration
- **Date & Time:** Saturday, July 4, 2026, **6–10 p.m.** with fireworks after dark [AOL](#)
- **Location:** Tom Brown Park, Capital Circle SE, Tallahassee
- **Highlights:** Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra headliner, multiple bands, kids’ activities, food trucks, and one of the largest fireworks shows in the Big Bend [AOL](#)
- **Admission:** Free; bring lawn chairs or blankets. Leave personal fireworks, grills, tents, and pets at home [AOL](#)

### City Fireworks Permit & Safety Rules

- **Permits:** Public fireworks displays and many private pyrotechnic uses require permits from the Tallahassee Fire Department and Special Events Office. Plan and apply early; fees and insurance requirements apply [us.citylaws.org](http://us.citylaws.org).
- **Safety Tips from TFD [City of Tallahassee Utilities+1](#):**
  - **Leave it to the pros:** Attend licensed displays to avoid handling fireworks.
  - **Obey laws:** Know what’s legal, where, and when you can use fireworks.
  - **Buy from licensed vendors:** Never make homemade fireworks.
  - **Follow instructions:** Maintain recommended safety distances and procedures.
  - **Choose a safe spot:** Open, outdoor area away from buildings, dry vegetation, and flammable materials.
  - **Have a water source:** Keep a bucket or hose nearby.
  - **Supervise kids & pets:** Keep children and pets away from fireworks.
  - **Protect your eyes:** Wear safety goggles.
  - **Dispose safely:** Soak spent fireworks before discarding in a metal container.
